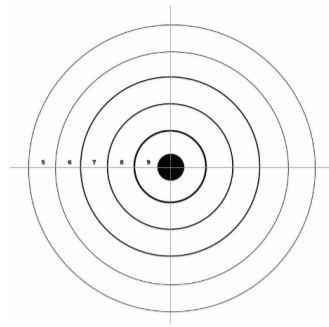

And when the smoke cleared Binalong had lost only 5 wickets for 213 off their 40 overs. The Harden Hornets were a bit shell shocked, although the Bushrangers were only using muzzle loaders.

Harden thought they would fight fire with fire. And their opening batting partnership was worth 34 when Paul Potts departed. Kai Steele his other partner batted on and hit up a fine 23, which included 4 fours. Jeff Brown dug in for a further 12 runs, together with James Woodhead's 13. However it was all down hill sailing for the Hornets, as the rest of their batsmen surrendered cheaply and they were all out for the neat- 100 runs. Jamie Glover, Oscar Knight, Michael Patterson all captured 2 wickets, But their star was Mark Dyball with just 2 overs and 3 wickets for only 10. The Hornets are only a young up and coming team and are certainly getting plenty of practice.
